Executive SUMMARY

During most of 2021, many areas of the country remained under full or partial shutdown from the pandemic. Washington, D.C., remained in full shutdown and did not begin to open up significantly until October 2021. Businesses and nonprofits, including ours, were forced to continue redefining work methods and processes, resulting in a continued heavier reliance on technology.

In 2021, we navigated several significant issues:

- **New Fellows:** In the summer, we hired and began training our new class of journalism fellows. Working remotely no longer created training issues that needed to be overcome. However, we did not hire as many fellows as usual, respectful of the drop in funding in 2020.
- **Building Update:** Our new building, purchased in early 2020, finally began renovation and repair in mid 2021. We anticipate the office reopening, and our staff to be working onsite, in early 2022.
- **Funding Growth:** We no longer competed with political candidates for financial support. That, along with the growing public resentment against corporate news media, and suspicion that election corruption has reached new heights, spurred our fundraising success significantly.

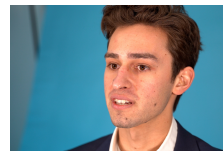

The scope of this project will carry us through the next presidential cycle in 2024.

Looking forward, we've set processes in place to alleviate 2021 setbacks and we will continue to capitalize on our 2021 successes in 2022.

2021 Impact!

The Collapse of New York Governor Andrew Cuomo



For the last year, our investigative team thought something fishy was going on with the New York nursing home death data and the odd responses from government officials. We released multiple [exclusive stories](#) exposing the concealed data and Cuomo's policies that were a factor in the nursing home deaths. The [facts we revealed](#) in our reporting played a role in the growing bipartisan calls to remove the governor. Fox News's Janice Dean even credited us directly on "Tucker Carlson Tonight" for our role in breaking this story.

Black Lives Matter Leadership and Misuse of Funds



We broke several [stories about Patrisse Cullors](#), co-founder of BLM's national arm, misusing funding. We broke that [she funneled](#) almost a quarter of a million dollars from BLM to a newly formed business, led by the father of her child. You may also remember our story on her multi-million dollar real estate spending spree.

After our reports, Cullors [stepped down](#) from her leadership position mentioning the "unfair treatment of a conservative news site." In fact, there was nothing unfair about our coverage. Leaders on the left are just not used to being held accountable by the press.

COVID-19 Origins - Chasing the Truth



The media wanted you to believe that questioning the origins of COVID-19 was conspiracy-mongering. The Daily Caller News Foundation led the way, reporting on the very credible possibility that the virus may have originated from a lab in Wuhan, China. Our news was being stifled by "scientists" and corrupt health institutions worldwide. As our investigative team worked non-stop, more and more evidence pointed to a lab origination at ground zero in Wuhan.

Journalistic and Ethical Standards - Our Code

We understand and appreciate that a news organization must have a bond of trust and credibility with its readers. In our experience we have learned that maintaining high principles of accuracy, transparency and fairness is the only way to keep that bond strong. Some of the keystone tenets that make up our journalistic and ethical standards are:

- We won't publish what we can't prove: It's not enough for us to "just know" something or follow "conventional wisdom."
- We rely on sources with first-hand knowledge: Gossip or rumors are not news. Although sometimes rumors may have newsworthiness, we won't adopt them as provably true.
- We rely on confidential sources as a last resort and only when the public interest demands it. We demand transparency from government officials and public actors, so we hold ourselves to the same standard.
- We respect privacy interests: We avoid salacious or titillating personal information as "click bait" and believe that matters such as personal and family life should be treated with good taste.
- The press has no special "right" to break laws in pursuit of a story: We are truth tellers dedicated to exposing wrongdoing. Knowingly violating the law in pursuit of the story is wholly unethical.

All complaints about a story's accuracy or fairness are taken seriously: We are committed to giving everybody a fair hearing if they believe a story is unfair or incorrect.

Concerned Parents Are Not Domestic Terrorists!



The government's response to the pandemic did terrible damage to our country this year. But there's one good thing that came from all the upheaval: We found out what children are really being taught in classrooms across the nation.

Parents rightfully worried about the radical left's takeover of our schools are showing up at board meetings everywhere demanding to be heard.

The left is fighting back with a massive, coordinated effort by corrupt players

in education, federal law enforcement and major news media to intimidate good parents out of engaging in their children's education.

These are among the most shameful, repugnant events we have ever seen in our lifetime because the victims -- our children -- are powerless to defend themselves. And to make matters worse, the National School Board Association enlisted the U.S. Attorney General and other law enforcement agencies to label parents as domestic terrorists so they can send federal agents after them.

Our team has been the boots on the ground, covering local school board meetings, talking to parents and uncovering information that ties school boards, teachers unions and federal agencies together in their coordinated attempt to discredit parents and protect their radical agenda.

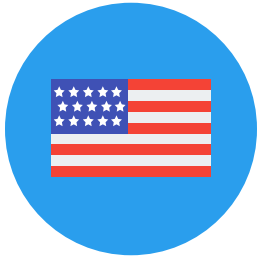

We hire and train young, full-time journalists through a comprehensive two-year fellowship program of news reporting coupled with education in conservative/libertarian political and economic science. This educational curriculum includes teachings from Friedrich Hayek, Milton Friedman, and other foundational theorists in political philosophy, economics, and public policy disciplines.

In addition to completing an educational curriculum, our Fellows publish hundreds of stories for free public consumption. At the end of their fellowships, we launch Fellows into careers at other media outlets across the political spectrum, from conservative to liberal.

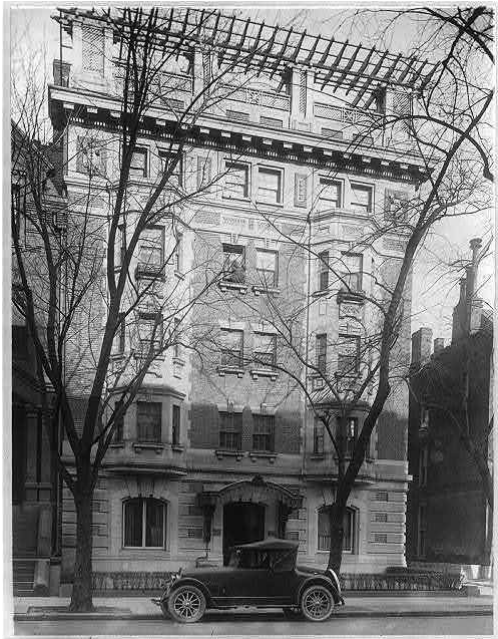

We have a dream home, a beautiful historic building less than two blocks from the White House. Once known as the Bachelor Apartment House, you can read more about it [here](#). The Tudor Revival style building has distinctive red brick, extensive intricate moldings, a mosaic tile lobby floor, and a location in the center of DC's business district. It is protected as a historic landmark registered with the National Register of Historic Places.

The building was purchased just as Covid-19 hit in 2020 and after a long lockdown, we finally began renovations in 2021. This permanent and premiere location lets everyone know that the Daily Caller News Foundation and The Daily Caller are here to stay.

This prime location provides a rare legacy naming opportunity, for there is no other available real estate within such close proximity to the White House.

Those who will pass through the halls of the building will include Congressional members, civic leaders, corporate CEOs, well known entertainers, movie producers and White House leadership and staff.

With approximately 20,000 square feet under the roof, the building features a beautiful winding staircase, multiple fireplaces, a rooftop terrace and room for growth. 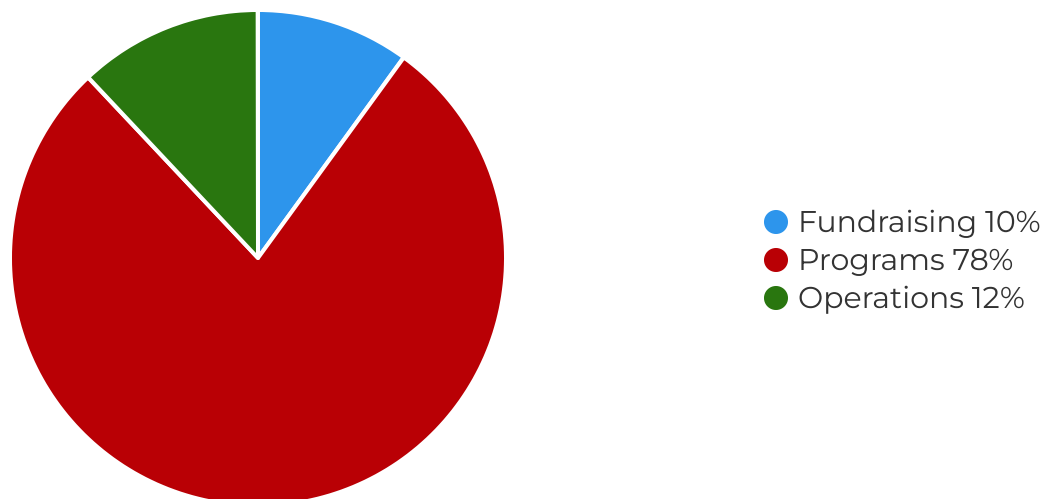

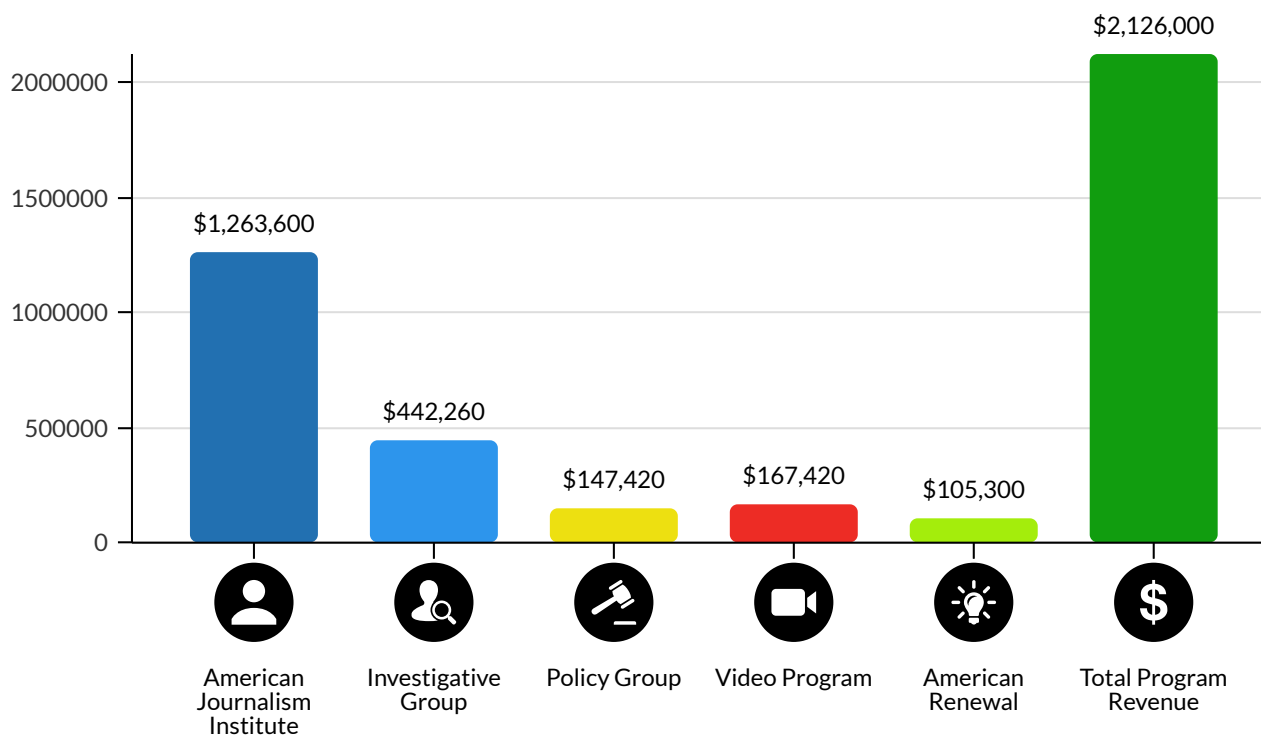
